: Loch Lomond (Luss Village)



Enjoy the quintessential Loch Lomond, combining the charm of the historic village of Luss with unique wildlife encounters, and a panoramic view of serene natural beauty.

: Rest and be Thankful Viewpoint



"Rest and Be Thankful" primarily refers to a famous, steep mountain pass in Argyll, Scotland, named because travellers paused here to rest and give thanks for safely reaching the summit of the challenging climb, a tradition continuing at the viewpoint overlooking the old military road built by General Wade.

: Inveraray Castle



Inveraray Castle, located on the western shore of Loch Fyne in Scotland, is a stunning example of Scottish baronial architecture. Built in the 18th century, it serves as the ancestral home of the Duke of Argyll. The castle features exquisite gardens and picturesque grounds, perfect for leisurely strolls.

: St Conan's Kirk



St Conan's Kirk, located near Loch Awe in Scotland, is a remarkable church known for its unique architectural style and picturesque setting. Built in the late 19th century, it combines elements of Gothic and Romanesque design, making it a standout landmark in the region.

: Oban



Oban, often referred to as the "Gateway to the Isles," is a charming seaside town located on Scotland's west coast. Renowned for its stunning natural beauty and vibrant maritime atmosphere, Oban is a popular destination for travelers seeking adventure, culture, and relaxation.

: Glencoe (Driving through Rannoch Moor)



Rannoch Moor, often described as one of the last true wildernesses in Britain, served as a significant filming location for the Harry Potter film series, primarily representing the desolate, wild landscapes through which the Hogwarts Express travels.

Iconic Scenes Filmed at Rannoch Moor

- The Death Eater Ambush (Deathly Hallows: Part 1): This is the most famous scene associated with the moor. In this sequence, Death Eaters board and search the Hogwarts Express while it is traveling across the bleak, boggy landscape.
- Dementor Attack (Prisoner of Azkaban): Some sources also note the moor's atmosphere was used to depict the landscape during the Dementor attack on the train in the third film.
- Horcrux Journey (Deathly Hallows: Part 1): The vast, marshy expanse provided a backdrop for Harry, Ron, and Hermione's treacherous journey through the wilderness.

: Three Sisters of Glencoe



The Three Sisters of Glencoe are three iconic, steeply-sided mountain ridges located in the Glen Coe valley of the Scottish Highlands. The individual ridges, which are part of the larger Bidean nam Bian mountain massif, are named Beinn Fhada (Long Hill), Gearr Aonach (Short Ridge), and Aonach Dubh (Black Ridge). For the photo opportunity and test of Scottish Highland explore driver will stop at

the Three Sisters of Glencoe.
